FEEDBACK ACTION TAKEN REPORT (YEAR 2020-21) DATE: 20/10/2021

STUDENTS

As responses received from students, 23% of students reported average about the ability to integrate topics beyond curriculum. 20% of students reported average about the superiority of our program in relation to the similar program in other institute. 22% of them reported average about the facilities provided in terms of infrastructure and audio-visual aids. 23% of them reported as average about the availability of extra classes and co-operation to solve individual problems. 23% of them reported average about the knowledge gained after curriculum.19% of them reported average about fairness in evaluation in assessment/internals. 18% of them reported average about the recent trends. Feedback of students were discussed and thereafter student centred programmes were conducted based on their suggestions. All these matters were discussed with the Dean and action were taken by adding add-on and value added courses for students. Instructions were given to form a curriculum committee for betterment of students.

ALUMNI

Feedback on relevance of the content of the course was analysed and it was found that 14% of alumni responded as average. Even 14% responded average for integration of topics beyond curriculum. Both these were discussed in college council committee regarding how newer trends can be added and in which way improvisation in curriculum can be done.

FACULTY

In the view of feedback provided by faculty, 6% teachers gave average response for integration of topics beyond curriculum and about the time adequacy provided for the completion of course so it was discussed in the college council committee for incorporation of advance or newer topics in syllabus.

PROFESSIONAL

Responses from professionals, 10% reported as average about the superiority of our program in relation to the similar program in other institute leads to take action by addition of newer concepts and trends to our curriculum for student's enrichment. All the departments were instructed to suggest newer topics on which knowledge can be shared with students beyond prescribed syllabus.

EMPLOYER

As responses received from employer 13% of them reported average about the knowledge gained after completion of course and27% employers reported as average about the availability of recent trends in institute. Instructions have been given to all departments to include newer topics based on updated books and journals in syllabus as well as message have been forwarded for purchasing newer equipment.
